Despite facing many challenges in elementary and secondary school, however, she persevered and fashioned a tremendously meaningful career path. She studied at Emerson College in Boston and earned her B.A. at San Francisco State University as well as a California Life Teaching Credential at U.C.L.A. Following her educational pursuits, Jane's first teaching position in South Central L.A. taught her that she needed to know more to be a teacher. She returned to Northern California and set up pilot educational programs in five recreational centers.

In 1984, Jane started substitute teaching in Oakland, Marin County, Jefferson County, and San Francisco Schools to gain access to and understand every perspective of the educational system. While exploring and cultivating her approach to education, Jane also authored two books and started a publishing business. In the late 80s, Jane worked under a National Endowment For The Arts Grant to develop a curriculum through which art could be used to teach other disciplines in the Northern Mariana Islands in Micronesia.

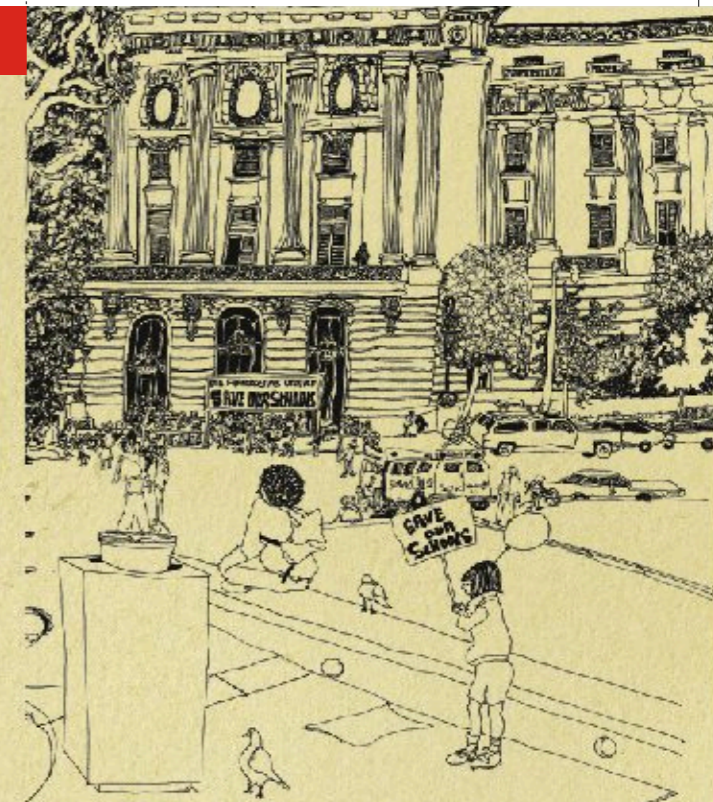

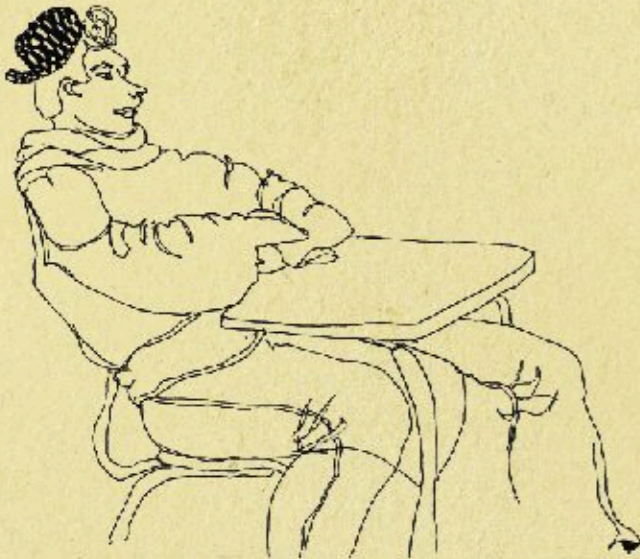
## The Business Community Must Recognize and Help Change our Failing Educational System...

Giant People is a non-profit organization that encourages youth to develop entrepreneurial and business skills through the art process.

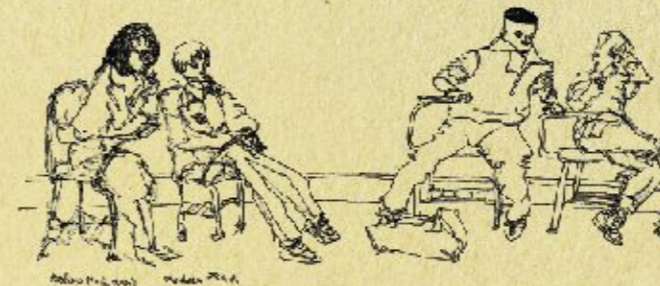
